

## District Recognizes “A” Schools

On January 7, the Greater Clark County Schools Board of Trustees recognized principals of schools that received an “A” letter grade from the Indiana Department of Education for the 2012-13 school year.

The A-F accountability report card for schools is figured based on performance, growth, and participation on the ISTEP+ assessment. Performance factors include the percentage of students passing English/Language Arts and Mathematics portions of the test. Growth is measured by the amount of academic progress all students make from spring to spring assessment dates.

The grading system holds schools to a very high standard and each school’s staff, students, and parents should be very proud of this accomplishment. Congratulations to our “A” schools – Charlestown High School, Jonathan Jennings Elementary, Maple Elementary, New Washington Elementary, Riverside Elementary, Spring Hill Elementary, Thomas Jefferson Elementary, Utica Elementary, and Wilson Elementary.

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## Report Card Procedures

Greater Clark County Schools’ student information system, PowerSchool, ensures data is exchanged in real time and as a result delivers the most current information available on a student. When teachers enter grades, the data is immediately available to the school, district office, and parents.

**PowerSchool**

First semester grades for the 2013-14 school year are currently posted in PowerSchool. With implementation of the one-to-one computer initiative and technology available to our families of students in grades 3-12, report cards will only be available by accessing PowerSchool Parent Portal.

Grades will also be posted for students in grades K-2 and a hard copy of the report card will be sent home with those students. Instructions about how to access your child’s grade in Parent Portal are attached.

**If you do not have a PowerSchool Parent Portal account, please contact your child’s school to obtain an access code and access password.** Instructions are attached about how to setup your Parent Portal account after obtaining your access information. A hard copy of your child’s report card can be provided if requested by the parent.

## Greater Clark Receives Environmental Stewardship Award

Harshaw Trane presented Greater Clark County Schools with the Environmental Stewardship Award on Tuesday, January 7 at the Board of School Trustees meeting. The award was presented to honor the district's positive contribution to the environment while also improving the quality of education for students. The district has demonstrated leadership in energy efficiency and in the creation of a high performance learning environment.



"The partnership between the Greater Clark County Schools Auxiliary Services Group and our Intelligent Services team has fostered an environment where energy efficiency and sustainability have become paramount in how the district operates its facilities," said Kyle Johnson, Harshaw Trane Account Manager.

From January 2010 through October 2013, New Washington Middle/ High, Riverside Elementary, and Pleasant Ridge Elementary have achieved an energy cost savings of \$88,942, while Parkview Middle School has saved \$13,252 from January 2013 through October 2013. In addition over \$49,500 in operational cost avoidance was achieved from January 2010 through October 2013. This is the equivalent of: 226 cars not driven for one year, 2,428 barrels of oil not burned, 134 household's electricity use for one year, or 9 acres of forest saved from deforestation.

Recently, all the schools mentioned were recognized for their achievements through the EPA's ENERGY STAR® program achieving ENERGY STAR recognition. Congratulations Greater Clark!
